Cement for the flag pole foundations was pored in late October. The poles were added mid-November and shortly after that the flags were flying.

Although the project is not totally paid for it was funded in part by a matching grant from Thrivent, along with a very generous anonymous donor.

The landscaping is not totally complete. The hopes are to finish that part of the project before Memorial Day 2015.


